This year Birmingham won League championships in cross country, swimming, basketball, track, and tennis. Nevertheless, the Maples did not win the All-Sports Trophy. The race was so close the results of two baseball games, both of which Ferndale won, were needed before the decision could be made. Ferndale finished first with 90.5 points, second was Birmingham with 87.5; Port Huron 85; East Detroit 67.5; Hazel Park 62; and Mt. Clemens 55. Only basketball, basketball, football and track count toward the all-sport trophy. With the boys of the June 1949 class playing a major part, the Maples again had a success-

ful year in sports. The captains of the teams were: Clay Joyce, football and baseball; Jim Patterson, cross country; Skip Halpin and Bob Polin basketball co-captains; Bob Webster, swimming; Pete Hartsuff, tennis; and Rollie McGinnis, track and field. The June class also contains three boys who are state class B champs in their individual events. Bob Webster, captain of the swimming team, took a first in the pole vault at state with a jump of 11 ft. 7 1/2 inches. Bob Polin, won the 220 yard dash and ran a fast leg on both the punting medley and the 800 relay team.
