

Pine Lake Vacation Houses Made Ready for Summer

Girls who want a moderate vacation of one or two weeks or more of outdoor fun may find just such a summer holiday at the Girls Friendly Society's three vacation houses on nearby Pine Lake, according to Mrs. George R. Clark of Detroit, chairman of the GFS Holiday House Committee.

Reservations still are open for girls in different age groups, from six years old to adults, Mrs. Clark points out. Swimming, hikes, boating, crafts and get-togethers at the outdoor fireplace are among activities offered.

"Birds Nest," the two-story cottage for girls of 6 to 11 years and "Holiday House," for girls of 12 to 20 years, will open July 2 and continue to Aug. 27. Each is staffed with a house mother and experienced counselors to guard safety in the water and on the grounds.

"Rest Cottage," the third vacation house on the beautiful 100-acre property, is for older girls and employed women desiring more quiet and relaxation. It opened May 28 and will continue until Oct. 22.

Sponsored by the Girls' Friend-

ly Society of Michigan, these vacation houses are on Pine Lake in Oakland County, about nine miles from Pontiac and 25 miles from Detroit, on Middlebelt road just north of West Long Lake road. Miss Myrtle Armstrong is camp director.
