Carnival Life Is Theme of Next St. Dunstan Play

For its annual outdoor production in the Greek Theatre at Cranbrook, St. Dunstan's Guild of Cranbrook is planning to present a new musical play based on "The Barker", Kenyon Nicholson's famous Broadway success about carnival life. The show, with a cast of 50 and 15 musical numbers, will run four evenings from Thursday, June 16, through Sunday, June 19, with curtain time at 7:30 p.m.

When it first appeared in New York, about two years ago, "The Barker" starred Walter Huston in his first dramatic role and presented Claudette Colbert in the role that provided her with a springboard to Hollywood.

Using the basic framework of the original play, which tells of the backstage life of a traveling carnival troupe, Sheldon Noble, long active with St. Dunstan's and the Detroit Players, has adapted the script into a two-act musical play. The songs form an integral part of the production and help to advance the plot, as in the case in such shows as "Carousel" and "South Pacific".

Two composers have provided the music for Mr. Noble's lyrics. Wiley Hitchcock, who at present teaches in the music department at the University of Michigan, has written most of the songs. Marjorie Henshaw, who has recorded several albums of piano music, has assisted him and also contributed three additional musical numbers.

The set, which will fill the large stage of the Greek Theatre, has been designed by Mrs. John W. Blonchard to represent the carnival midway in front of the "Pearls of the Orient" sidewalk. The ingenious setting includes a two-story custom-made side-show banners and a miniature revolving ferris wheel in the background.

Jervis B. McMechan is directing the large cast, assisted by Royanne Thompson, Sheldon Noble, production manager, Marlene Kohlsaat is the music director.
