## Cars Can't Stop on a Dime, Police Advise Motorists

You've heard of people who can stop their cars on a dime. That's a slight exaggeration, with the emphasis on the slight, according to the Traffic Safety Association of Detroit.

Actually it takes 60 feet or approximately the distance between the pitcher's box and Biggie Stadium and home plate, to stop a car going 25 miles per hour—the legal speed limit in Birmingham unless unbraked otherwise, the Association says. And that's with good brakes on good dry pavement.

The association points this out in connection with the accident prevention program now being conducted against smashups caused by excessive speed. Birmingham's police and traffic judges are co-operating in this program, which is also part of a state-wide effort against speeding drivers.

**Increase Sharply**  
"The distance it takes to stop an automobile increases much more sharply than the actual speed," officials say. "A car traveling 40 miles per hour, for example, needs 126 feet to stop."

"A car going 40 miles per hour travels 52 feet per second. It takes the average person three-quarters of a second to react to a danger—a situation, which means the car has traveled 44 feet during this period of inaction," the Association explains. "After the brakes have been applied, it takes an additional 82 feet to stop—a total of 126 feet."

General theme of the program in Detroit and throughout the state is: "SPEEDERS ARE LOSING THEIR LICENSES."
