A coronet of lace held the bride's flange veil of illusion and as she was escorted to the altar by her brother, Charles C.

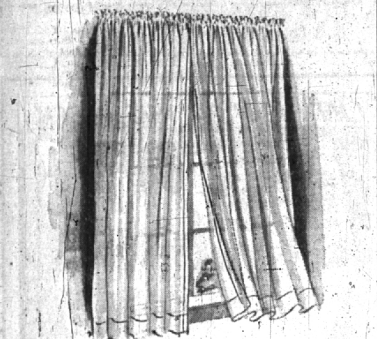
