**Lt. Orr to Fly Jet Bomber in Army Exercise**

SHREVEPORT, La. — Second Lt. Donald E. Orr, of 1572 Bennaville Ave., Birmingham, Mich., has departed with his unit, the 48th Bomb Squadron, Light (Jet), for San Marcos, Tex., to take part in an Air Force summer exercise. 47th Bomb Wing Commander Colonel W. F. Chapman has announced that at wing headquarters here at Barksdale Air Force Base.

The 15-day exercise, known as Operation "910", will take place in the countryside around San Marcos, and near the finish of the exercise there will be a bombing demonstration in the vicinity of Matagorda Island.

Purpose of the exercise is to "check out" pilots of the Air Force Reserve as first pilots in B-29 "Invader" bombers. In addition to the transition in light bombardment type aircraft, there will be many phases of the instruction to better acquaint the personnel with modern equipment.

**Two Exhibits Open at Cranbrook Museum**

An exhibition of water colors of the western hemisphere opens July 1 at the Museum of the Cranbrook Academy of Art, Bloomfield Hills. The 113 paintings are from the permanent collection of the Fine Arts department, International Business Machines Corporation, are the work of artists in Central and South America, Cuba, Canada and the United States.

Since art is one of the most important means for revealing the heart and mind of a people, it is especially important to play an increasingly important part in the development of a more thorough understanding between countries, the Academy points out.

Beginning July 10, the museum will exhibit The Brookings Museum print annual, 60 outstanding prints selected from the third national print annual, created by the American Federation of Arts. From the 4,300 entries submitted, prints have been selected in which the artist has succeeded in setting down a convincing expression of the chosen subject. Shows technical accomplishment does not merit inclusion in the collection unless accompanied by an active and creative expressiveness. Included are drawings, engravings, etchings, lithographs and woodcuts.

Both of these exhibits will continue through the month of July. Museum hours are from 2 to 5 (July) except Mondays and holidays.
