NOTICE GARBAGE COLLECTION REGULATIONS

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to authority contained in Paragraph B Section 2 of Ordinance No. 344 of the City of Birmingham, the following regulations pertaining to the collection of garbage have been adopted by the Birmingham City Commission, and shall become effective upon publication.

1. Containers from which the garbage contractor will make collections shall be kept at or within five (5) feet of ground level.
2. Where garbage containers are kept within garages or other enclosures, free and unobstructed access to such garages or enclosures shall be provided to the garbage contractor.
3. Where garbage is deposited in two or more containers for collection, such containers shall be kept as nearly side-by-side as possible.
