At a meeting of the Home Gardeners of the Women's National Farm and Garden Association yesterday morning, Mrs. Alice Wessels Barlingame spoke on "Placing the Right Shrub in the Right Place."

Some of her suggestions were Siberian pea tree, lilac and mock orange for a screen; the flowering quince for a spectacular hedge; the Nankin cherry for profuse early bloom; the kerria japonica and arrow wood viburnum for a shady problem and for beautiful leaf texture, the tartarian honeysuckle with its blue green leaf and pink blossom.

Mrs. Frank D. Webb, chairman of the group, gave the members to add something new to their borders this year.

Mrs. Webb also had seven garden hints for March. These included: 1) indoor year growing time is here, eggplant, tomatoes, early cauliflower, cabbage, etc.
