Police Chief Moxley addressed the Newcomers Club after the monthly luncheon last Thursday. The tables were decorated in green and white, with small St. Patrick's day flags at each place.

Mrs. Robert R. Wessels, president of the Newcomers Club, and a large group of hostesses were on hand to welcome the 115 members who attended the luncheon.

Mrs. Wessels reminded the members that newcomers are invited to attend the family dinner which will be held at the Community house at 6:30 p.m. on March 31 after which a colored movie entitled "Enjoying Your State of Michigan" will be shown by Mr. Clarence Tinker, public relations chairman of the Department of Conservation for the State of Michigan.
