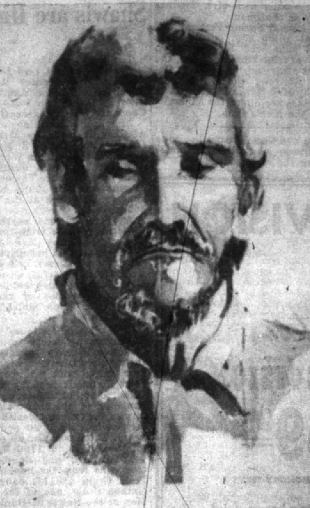
Newcomers Plan Tour of Cranbrook May 19

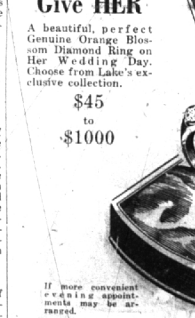
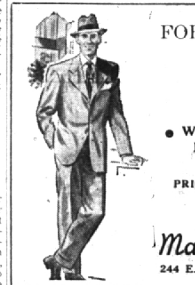
