The Right Rev. Richard S. Emrich, Ph.D., S.T.D., will visit Christ Church Cranbrook at the eleven o'clock service on Sunday for the purpose of administering confirmation. A class composed of approximately 60 children and adults will be presented.

Bishop Emrich, the seventh Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Michigan, is the son of Congregational missionaries. He was born in 1910 in Mardin, Turkey. He studied in Phillips Academy, Andover, Mass., and graduated from Brown University in 1932.

He then studied for a year at the Episcopal Theological School, and two years at Union Seminary in New York City, where he graduated in 1935 with a degree of bachelor of divinity. Receiving a fellowship for study in Europe, he obtained his Ph.D. at the University of Marburg.
