Scout Scholarship Examinations Are Stated for May 21

May 21 has been set as the date when Boy Scouts will take the examination for the three-year scholarship provided by the Culver educational foundation. The award, which has been made each year since 1931, is in memory of Emily Jane Culver, wife of the founder of Culver Military Academy in Indiana. The winner will receive three years' training at the academy, in preparation for a college or university career. He will be given every opportunity provided in its broad program of physical, military, citizenship and character-building training. Nominations from the Detroit Area Council, which includes Bir-

mington, must be made with the Scout Council on or before May 15. The selected candidates will take the final examination May 21, which will select the winner of the scholarship. The examination will be given under the supervision of a teacher approved by the boy's parents and the Scout executive. To be eligible for the examination the Scout must be between the ages of 13 and 15, as of April 1, 1949, and must be in grade 10B as of this June 1. He must be an active Scout, holding first class rank or higher, and must be in the upper 10 per cent of his school class. Physical requirements state that he must be at least five feet, one inch tall and in good all-round health. Zoning, Drainage Problems Discussed by Southfield Bd.

SOUTHFIELD—In the absence of the supervisor, Dudley P. Frame, the board meeting was conducted by John Pollock. Some of the outstanding motions carried included a salary increase for the assistant building inspector Hugh Gibson to \$3,600 and cost allowance of \$600.

The Magnolia drainage system has become a heated controversy between the city of Detroit, Oakland county and Southfield Township. The city complains that storm waters dumping into drains at Northwestern, Southfield, and W. Eight Mile road extend "untidily outside a reasonable conception of natural drainage and a violation of the proper use of natural drainage courses." The water floods into ditches overflowing into private properties. The new pump lately put into operation will be paid for by the property owners in an emergency setup. Letters were read at the meeting concerning the issue. No immediate action was taken.

A complaint was made by Mr. and Mrs. Henry Crossett, Arthur Kautz and John D. Lessnau that certain residential sections in the vicinity of Nine Mile, Telegraph and Northwestern, are being turned into places of business and signs erected to that effect. The complaint was referred to the building inspector.

Greenfield, Beverly Hills Improvement association sent representatives to the meeting regarding zoning violations. The Board requests more definite information before it can take action. Harold Thompson of Riverbank

Golf club was present to ask the board for reconsideration of his request for a class "C" license. Considerable discussion and questioning followed with the result that the action taken April 12 will be rescinded.
