Mich. Bell Cuts Overtime Charges to Three Areas

The Public Service Commission has approved an application of the Michigan Bell Telephone Company to eliminate overtime charges on all one-unit interzone messages in the Detroit district exchange, effective this Saturday.

For Birmingham users, starting on that date, the order will remove overtime charges on calls to Longacre, Royal Oak, and Southfield, according to Walter J. Fauser, chief manager for the company. Overtime charges also will be eliminated on calls to Auburn Heights, Big Beaver, and Pontiac, effective next spring.

The order means that uniform overtime treatment will be applied in the future to all one-unit messages in the Detroit district exchange, whether they be interzone, intrazone, or inter-exchange in character.

At the present time, customers who made one-unit messages which were charged five cents for the first five minutes, then an overtime charge for time in excess of the five minutes, Fauser said.
