are beauties, and we got 298 snafus for this month's supply," Wolfe added.

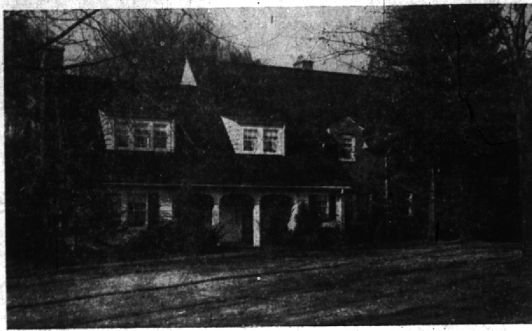

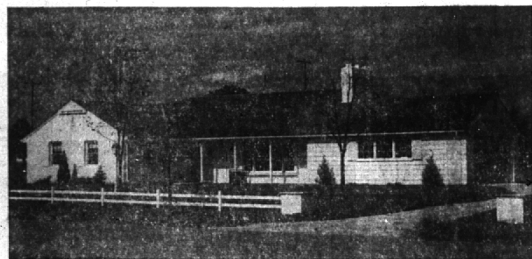
