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### Anniversary Sunday

On Sunday, Nov. 20, First Methodist Church will observe its 128th anniversary by holding two services, one at 11:00 a.m. and the other at 7:00 p.m. The guest speaker for the occasion will be Bishop Charles W. Brashares, of Des Moines, Iowa.

It was 128 years ago that the first sermon was preached in Birmingham by a Methodist itinerant preacher in the Willetts Log Tavern. In 1828 this little settlement was added to the Oakland Circuit which included Troy, Perrin school, Auburn, Farmington and Pontiac, and four years later acquired the name "Birmingham."

The first church built in Birmingham was done by these Methodists in 1829 and stood at the corner of Merrill and Bates streets. Thirty-four years later, 1873, the present brick building was dedicated, the cost of the structure amounting to \$20,000. Many friends and former members of the church return annually for the anniversary services.

Bishop Charles Brashares became a bishop of the Methodist Church five years ago, and was assigned to the Oakland Circuit and area. Just prior to his election to the bishopric he had ministered the First Methodist Church, Ann Arbor, for ten years (1934 to 1944).

In 1948 he made a tour of the world as a representative of the council of Bishops.

The morning worship will be appropriate to the occasion. The evening service will be most informal. After the worship in the sanctuary, refreshments will be served in the church parlors to all in attendance. The public is cordially invited to attend.

### Ceylon Native Will Speak Here Nov. 23 at Baptist Church

A Christian leader of the Orient has included Birmingham in his American itinerary. He is the Rev. Dr. S. Selvaratnam, a native of Ceylon. He will speak at the First Baptist Church on Wednesday, Nov. 23, at the regular Midweek Meeting, 8 p.m.

The Rev. Mr. Selvaratnam is on a brief speaking tour in this country. He is scheduled to give addresses at several colleges and seminaries.

Rev. Selvaratnam was born in Ceylon in 1906. He received his education in a Methodist missionary school in his native city, Nov. 1925, at the regular Midweek Meeting, 8 p.m.

For several years Rev. Selvaratnam continued his ministry as a pastor. He served as the minister in an interdenominational Ashram, a place of retreat and training for converts into the Christian faith. In addition to his teaching and pastoral work, Mr. Selvaratnam also was a leader in the movement among students in the East.

His present church affiliation is with the United Church of South India. Last summer he was in Europe at the invitation of the Ecumenical Institute, Chateau de Bossey, Cologny, Switzerland. While at the Institute he was frequent lecturer to various lay groups. The meeting is open to the public.
