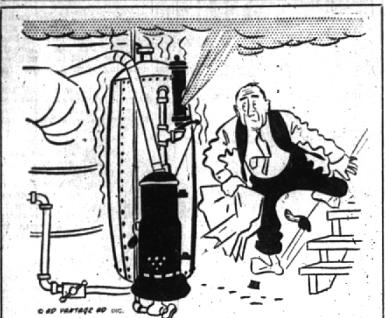

Master Planning of Nearby Oak Park Is Assignment of David S. Beer

Planning a model city for a potential population of 40,000, Oak Park's city council has retained David S. Beer of E. Long Lake road, Bloomfield Hills, to prepare a basic master plan for the city.

Beer is now consultant to the Chicago plan commission. During the past two years he has acted as city planner and director of Oak Ridge, Tenn., for the Atomic Energy Commission; as consultant to the Yellow Springs, O., as consultant in preparation of a general development plan for Monterey, Calif.

For three years prior to 1947 he was the associate in charge of the city and site planning department of the office of Saarinen, considered a success, according to the treasurer's report.

"Traveling Baskets"
