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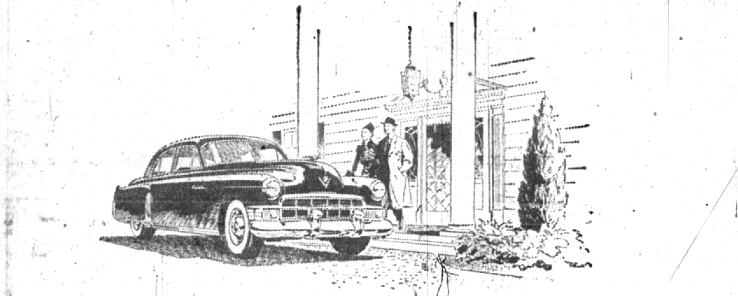
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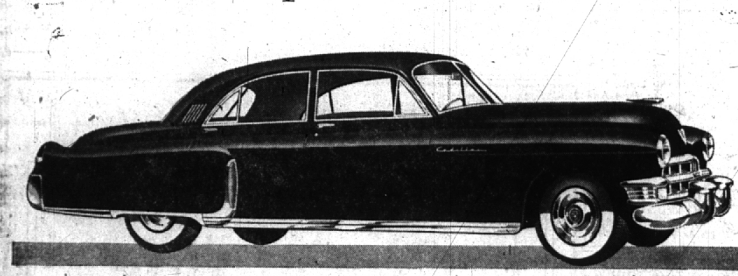

Bishop Craighill at Christ Church

On Sunday, Nov. 27, the Rt. Rev. Lloyd R. Craighill, D.D., former Bishop of North Carolina, will preach at the 11:00 a.m. Service at Christ Church Cranbrook.

Bishop Craighill was Bishop of Anking, China from 1940 until his retirement in September, 1946. Prior to his coming to Bishop, he had been a missionary in China for 25 years.

At the time of the outbreak of war between China and Japan in 1937, Dr. Craighill went to Wuhu and was engaged in the care of more than 2,000 refugees in the Lion Hill and St. Lioba's compounds of the American Mission. The city was overrun by the Japanese army and conditions similar to the "rape of Nanking" prevailed.

Later he went to Kuling to help prepare a place of refuge for the families of Chinese clergy and other Christian families of the Diocese of Anking.

For about four months nearly 500 men, women, and children were cared for there, but when the Kuling mountains were nearly surrounded by the Japanese army and food supplies were cut off he left Kuling and went to Shanghai through mountain trails on foot to a place of safety. Later he returned to Shanghai and served for a year as treasurer of the Diocese of Anking.

After Pearl Harbor Bishop Craighill was interned by the Japanese, first in Wuhu and later in Shanghai. He was released in the second trip of the S.S. Gripsholm in December, 1942.

Soon after the internment he returned to China, arriving in Shanghai in December, 1945. For the next three and a half years he was engaged in the rehabilitation of the Diocese, the repair and replacement of war-damaged buildings and equipment in the restoration and promotion of the work of churches, schools and hospitals. During this period he assisted in carrying through various relief programs for the distribution of food and clothing for medical relief and for assistance to students and the families of Chinese pastors and clergy.
