Some Streets to Get Seal Coat in 1950

Part of City's Plan to Cut Down Cost of Maintenance

To save as many street surfaces as possible and to cut down street maintenance costs, the city commission Monday night approved an extensive "seal coat" program for next year.

All streets which were curbed and gutters which were cleaned with a seal coat of heavy asphaltic oil, as well as certain other selected streets that have the best breakdown of the accident causes during September showed the best results in the past.

Paving Program in Offing

In outlining the program to the commission, City Manager Donald C. Egbert explained this measure would hold the streets in pretty good condition, possibly up to eight years, until a comprehensive paving program could be undertaken.
