his fellowmen and enjoy their friendships and that such friendships can add to the good life of the individual.
"After those objectives were defined, the design of the school began to take on form to those functions," Ireland said.
As a result, many faculty meetings were held to get teachers' ideas on the ways and means of providing ample facilities for the Birmingham school program.

Get Further Suggestions
After the architect had designed tentative plans based on the objectives of the school and teachers' suggestions, Ireland said the plans were presented to educational authorities for further suggestions and modifications.
Graduate classes in school administration at both Ohio State and Syracuse universities highly endorsed the plans.
Parkins and Hill of Chicago, nationally known school architects who are consultants on this school program, came to Birmingham to consult personally with the local architects, Swanson Associates, and board educational members. A number of excellent suggestions were incorporated in the plans, and the Chicago firm's endorsement and approval.
"The architects, E. W. Sealhorn, board president, and myself reviewed the plans with Wilfred Clapp of the building division of the Michigan Department of Public Instruction and his staff, as well as Dr. Robert Koopman of the division of instruction," Ireland said. "We were told the plans were excellent."

Compliments Functional Design
A member of the school service division of the University of Michigan has complimented the functional design and the completeness of the plans, the school superintendent related.
Board of education members have taken trips to Lansing and Chicago to study recent school buildings.
"Sixteen high school in Lansing was carefully studied, as well as Evanston township high school and New Trier high school in Indian River, Ill.," Ireland continued. "Crow Island school in Winnetka and new schools under construction in Glenview, Ill. were also visited."
"Seahorn and myself visited the campus type of high school consisting of six buildings in Shorewood, Wis., to see whether or not such schools were practical and desirable in this climate."

Has Been Carefully Studied
"The plans have been reviewed by many visiting superintendents and their suggestions have been solicited and incorporated whenever feasible."
"It is therefore evident that the new building program in Birmingham is based upon careful study over a period of years and represents the best thing of the moment. It is simple in design, functional in arrangement, and represents the artistic balance which characterizes the work of the architects employed to do this design."
"Nothing could happen in the Birmingham area which would add to the pride and dignity of the community and truly label it as a 'residential area' seeking the best educational and cultural for the children who are privileged to live in this area," Ireland concluded.

City Participation in Joint Authority Sought by Berkley

There is no particular reason why Birmingham should be interested in a joint authority to administer the collection of garbage and rubbish from several South Oakland county communities, City Manager Donald C. Egbert told city commissioners Monday evening.
The city of Berkley has asked Birmingham to appoint a representative to meet and assist in the formation of such an authority.
"Birmingham has purchased property for the disposal of rubbish, and I question the advisability of the city joining in this authority," Egbert advised.
The commission asked him to attend these meetings to learn about the plan in more detail.

Fire Department Had 16 Calls Last Month

Birmingham has recorded another month of minimum fire losses. The 17 runs made by the fire department last month averaged slightly over \$1 per run in property damage, or a total of \$20. Fire Chief V. W. Griffith stated in his monthly report that a total of 638 hours were spent fighting fires.
During the month a total of 118 instances of buildings were made with three turned over to the Fire Prevention Bureau for further inspection and recommendations.

Southfield B of E Accepts Bids for Magnolia Addition



SOUTHFIELD — Bids totaling \$55,500 for the construction of additions to the Magnolia school were accepted by the Southfield Township board of education Monday night at its regular meeting.
They will provide another classroom, an adequate kindergarten, kitchen, teachers' restroom, and additional children's lavatory facilities.
The board set November 14 as the deadline for submission of bids on a house, barn and outbuilding on the site of the proposed Southfield township high school at 10 Mile and Labor roads.
The big road water main, considered as a possible source of water for the new high school, was rejected as being inadequate for high school needs.
77 Acres Annexed to District
The board has been officially notified that the Wayne and Oakland county boards of education have approved the annexation of 77 acres of Redford Union school district to the Southfield district.
Superintendent of Schools Glenn Schoenhals reported to the board that 892 Southfield students are attending high schools in Highland Park, Royal Oak, Berkley and Detroit.
He said tuition charges range from \$44 to \$222 per pupil for a total cost to the Southfield district of \$107,888. Of this amount, the state will reimburse the board the sum of \$79,342, he said.
The board received 50 bids on the Magnolia addition, and this was the third time the board had met to consider the awards. At the two previous meetings, it was decided the bids were still too high.
