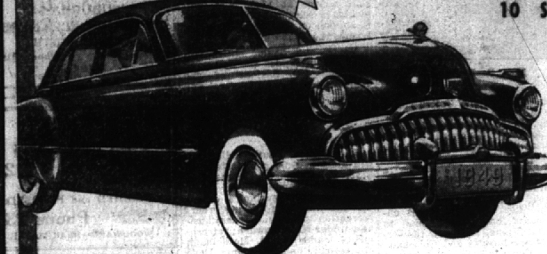

Off on a long gain around right end is Don Dupuis, Barnum halfback, in last week's game against Hazel Park. The Parkers scored the only touchdown, winning the game 6 to 0.

In a ragged game marred by eight fumbles, Hazel Park defeated Barnum 6-0 at the Parkers' home field last week.  
During the first quarter, play centered around the 50-yard line as Hazel Park's brilliant 20-yard run to the Parkers' 22 as the period ended.  
Merrill Schlaack opened the second quarter with an 11-yard run to the Hazel Park 11, and swept left end on the next play to score, only to have the touchdown called back because of a 15-yard offensive holding penalty.  
On fourth down Jim Wheeler's attempted pass did not succeed and Hazel Park took over on the Parkers' 26. The Barnum threat was stopped.  
**Hazel Park Scores**  
After a Hazel Park pass put the ball on their own 35, Jim Row-

land smashed off left tackle and out ran four defensive backs to rack up the Parkers' lone tally.  
Barnum had one more scoring chance before the end of the half but Mutch's pass to Schlaack was short. On fourth down Mutch fumbled but recovered for a loss of 11 yards as the half ended, Hazel Park 6, Barnum 0.  
Except for a few plays, the ball was in Barnum territory all through the rest of the game, neither team scoring.  
In losing 6-0 to Hazel Park Barnum went down to its third straight defeat, previously losing to Pontiac Eastern and Royal Oak.
