Ceremonies Mark Cub Activities at First Fall Meeting

Moving swiftly into high gear, Adams School Cub Pack B-8 will hold its first meeting in the school gymnasium Tuesday, Oct. 11, at 7:30 p.m. with a program honoring former Cubs who are graduating into Boy Scouting.

For the past month a group of more than 20 former Cubs have been going through intensive training under direction of J. E. Welobes and Tenderfoot requirements. This group, christened "SCUBS" (the first part of "Scouting" and the last part of "Cubbing"), is composed of 11 and 12 year old boys, who under a change in national Scout regulations are now qualified for Scouting.

A formal Welobes ceremony will be staged at the Pack meeting Tuesday night under direction of T. H. Mabley, Cubmaster, and J. E. Welby, ceremonial chairman. A farewell to Cubbing and a greeting to Scouting will be given. At the same time all incoming Bolocat Cub Scouts under new regulation all boys 8, 9 and 10 years old now participate in Cubbing) will place their own sticks on the council fire as an indication of joining the Pack. The boys have carved fagot sticks in their initial Den Meetings, each with their own name on the stick.

Fire Marshall George Scott, Birmingham fire marshal, will present a short talk and demonstration on fire prevention. As October is fire prevention month, the Cub program has been built around that subject.

New pack officials will be introduced and the Cubs will join together as Dens for the first time. At a laddad hike last Saturday, more than 88 boys and 40 dads participated in a series of outdoor woodland games. The Cubs followed a paper trail to the site of the council fire, and after playing games cooked hot dogs over the fire.

A unique contest saw six dads vying with each other to boil water in a tin can, after being given only one "kitchen" match. At the council fire Robert J. Gougeon, assistant cubmaster, led the group in songs. Robert G. Silbar, pack chairman, introduced Mabley as Cubmaster. He outlined some of the activities the boys will participate in this fall. A large group of dads, under direction of Harold Chalk and Richard Sneed, handled details of the laddad hike.

Quonset Hut Unit to Sell for \$450

Deciding it was easier to sell quonset hut units by negotiation rather than by seeking bids, the city commission has told City Manager Donald C. Egbert to sell a unit for \$450 if he can find a buyer at this price.

The city is seeking buyers for two of the quonset huts from its veterans housing areas. The Poppleton huts are scheduled for complete dismantling by the first of the year, while part of the Cranbrook project may be extended until next July should it be determined that any occupant is having a difficult time getting new housing.

New Power Shovel May Be Needed

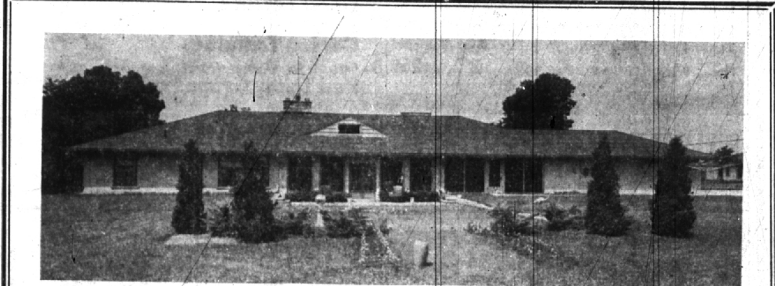
