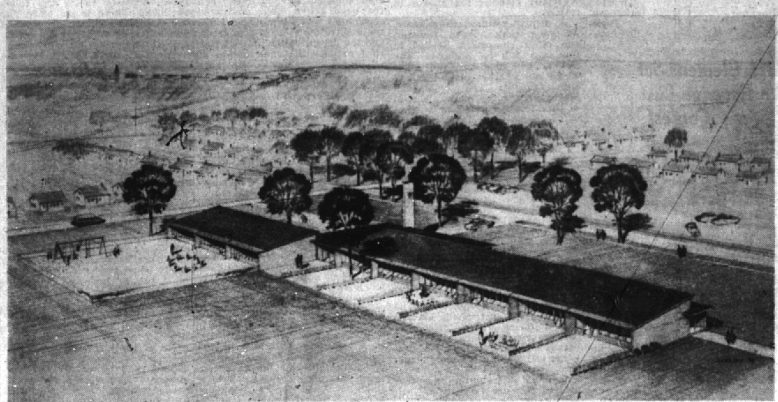


## Architect's Drawing of Proposed Torry Elementary School



The Birmingham Board of Education's proposed \$3,100,000 expansion program includes this new 9-room elementary school for the Torry site in the southeastern section of the city. ## Residential Rate Change
