**Oakland County RED CROSS NEWS**

The Oakland County Chapter, American Red Cross, Mrs. Hugh D. McLeese, social welfare aide chairman, announces the following training program, beginning October 4 and continuing every Tuesday through November 22.

Unit No. 1, meeting October 4 and October 11, for six hours. Each is to cover the background of social work for volunteers; the relationship of the volunteers and the staff to the various social agencies and administrative body, and inter-relationship of agency services and basic philosophy underlying services to people. This is to be given by members of the local chapter and social association workers.

Unit II, beginning October 18, will have three hour sessions. It will be directed to the study of how the Red Cross helps people, technique of interviewing, simple recording, letter writing, filing of claims, securing affidavits and other Red Cross activities.

All Red Cross services have to be preceded by an orientation course which will take approximately two hours in the first day's program. All social welfare aides who took the course last spring
