Starr Commonwealth was started by Floyd Starr near Albion about 36 years ago. Starr began the movement, firmly believing that the so-called "bad boys" were good boys who had had bad breaks. To back his faith, 91 per cent of the kids who have been there have made good.

Today the 1,500-acre farm has 165 residents, with plans for 250. The boys are living healthy, happy lives, under the direction of highly trained teachers, social workers and house mothers.

The boys work, not as punishment but as education. Their school standards are high and most are regular church attendants at Albion or nearby Marshall.

Starr says that most of the boys remain in the school two years, leaving there to enter life as soldiers, engineers, doctors, etc., with an entirely new outlook, new faith and a deep-rooted desire to become useful citizens.
