

## City Approves Riviera Sewer

A new combined sewer for Riviera, between North and Oxford, received final approval from the city commission Monday evening.

To cost an estimated \$9,300, the sewer will be installed by the city.

private property owners share is \$7,124 to be paid in three equal installments.

Turned inadequate by the city, the present sewer contributes to flooding of basements at the east end of the street.

City manager Donald C. Egbert said the project will go out for bids as soon as 75 per cent of the cost is paid in, which could mean construction by next spring.

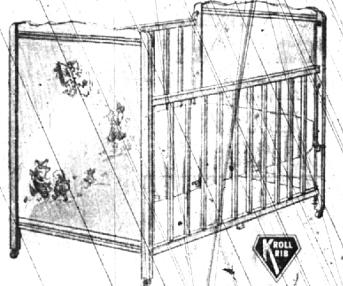
