Mrs. FRANK WEBB suggests planting flowering crabs now and gives the following garden hints for April: Lawns need three yearly feedings—start now with 10-6-4 fertilizer. Add humus once every three years. Buy the best grass seed. Lime only when needed. 2. Place wood ashes around peonies and delphiniums to prevent botrytis, also Bordeaux mixture. 3. Prune roses now, apply bone meal and balanced rose food. 4. For specimens bloom on spring bulbs feed with liquid superphosphate when buds appear. 5. Divide chrysanthemums every three years. Plan nursery now for the plants to transplant to the border when needed.

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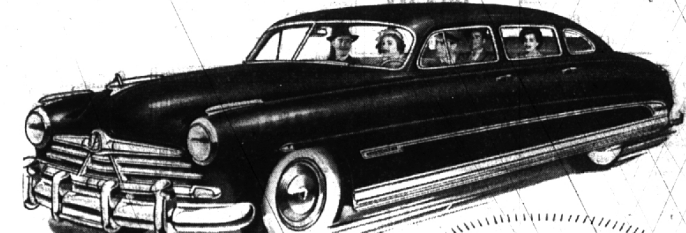


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
