"Broadway" Cast is Announced; is Next St. Dunstan's Show

A run of two-hundred perform-
ances in Detroit alone was one of
the records established by the
Philip Dunning-George Abbott
comedy melodrama "Broadway"
which St. Dunstan's Guild of Cran-
brook is reviving for four per-
formances in the Cranbrook Pavil-
ion, Friday and Saturday, April
14 and 15 and 21 and 22.

"Broadway" played at the old
Garfield Theatre from April
through November of 1927 and set
a long-run record exceeded by few
other plays in Detroit theatrical
history.

The St. Dunstan's Guild pro-
duction, directed by Jervis B. Mc-
Mechan, has been planned to cap-
ture the mood of the mid-twenties
with songs, dances and costumes
of that colorful period.

W. H. Adams, Jr., plays the role
of Roy Lane, the night club ho-
telier, which brought Lee Tracy star-
dom in the original New York
show. Mr. John R. Lakin plays
opposite him as Billie Moore, one
of the chorus girls; and Roscoe
Godfrey appears in another lead-
ing role as Steve Crandall, a big-
time bootlegger.

MRS. OTIS THOMPSON, cast as
Lili Rose, a torch singer, will do
several songs of that era during
the course of the show.

The chorus girls who have a
number of song and dance routines
include: Marie Moore, Mary Mc-
Clay, G. Wright, Shirley Trump,
Teddy Davis and Elizabeth
Koska.

Lewis C. Keenan plays Nick
Verdi, the owner of the Paradise
Singles Club where the action takes
place; Robert Field is the detec-
tive from Homicide Squad; Alan
Gormick, William G. Wright, Har-
ris Machus, Fred Graef, Hamilton
Paterson and Alan Wentz are
gangsters and Marcia Wentz is the
cigarette girl.
