Miss Drake will be her sister's maid of honor and another sister, Mary is to be a bridesmaid.

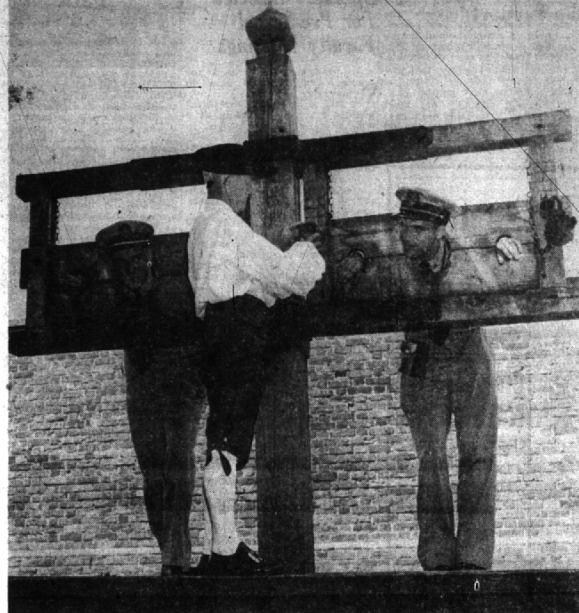
