Kordo Kuts Kapers In Store Window

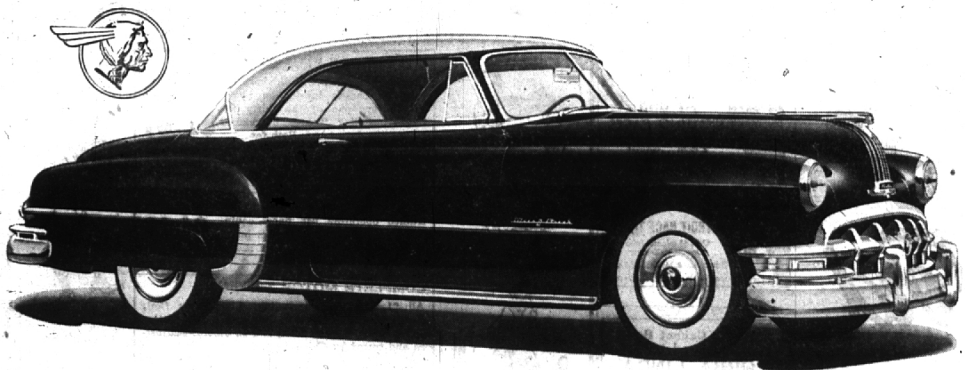
