SUNDAY DINNER Suggestions

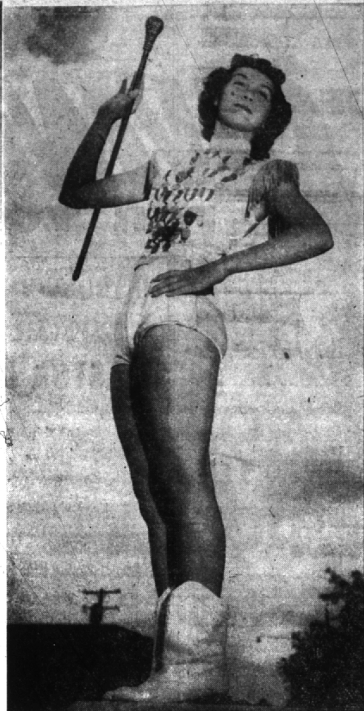
THE head that cooks the cradle has to do the roasting too. No wonder they say a woman is the pivot of the home. In this modern day and age there seems to be even more work to be done around the house than before. Planning the menu, shopping for and preparing the family's meals are no small part of the housewife's busy day.

A little help for the homemaker might be welcome. So this week A & P's Service for Homemakers suggests a handsome and thrifty dish for Sunday dinner—Brown Beef Stew.

To prepare this appetizing meal, take two pounds of beef, chuck, neck or shin, and wipe with a damp cloth. Cut into one-inch cubes, rub with a third of a cup of seasoned flour. Melt two tablespoons fat in a heavy skillet or Dutch oven; brown the meat on all sides. Add three cups of boiling water, two tablespoons chopped parsley, one celery top, third of a cup of sliced onion, one bay leaf and three cloves. Cover and simmer gently over low heat about two and a half hours or until meat is almost tender. Then add six small onions, six carrots and one cup diced celery. Continue cooking about half an hour or until meat and vegetables are tender. Add more water as necessary. Remove meat and vegetables to a hot platter. There is ample here for six servings and no more than a tossed green salad need be added.

After this nutritious main dish, why not serve a plate of fresh peach pie with vanilla ice cream, together with the family's favorite beverage.

Jones Production Scheduled for September 7, 8, 9

Those who feel that Detroit and its environs are lacking in dance talent, would have a pleasant surprise if they looked in on rehearsals of "Millennium Sunday", a dance-drama to be presented at the Cranbrook Greek theater on September 7, 8 and 9.

Austin Jones and Marion Nevill Kirk have called upon dancers from Birmingham, Detroit, Royal Oak, Pontiac and Berkley to contribute their talents for the coming production.

Austin Jones of Greenwood avenue, who is known locally for his dramatic work, is author, director and dramatic lead of the show.

MISS KIRK, director of the dance, who has studied with Martha Graham and other modern dance artists, has been instructed and choreographing for the Cranbrook Summer Theater school. During the winter she directs a teen-age modern dance group in Birmingham and is a teacher at the Royal Oak High school.

Among the dancers participating in the Jones production are Reva Geer, Leona Zelfafek, Pat Terry, Edward Kalata and Harvey Meyer from Detroit.

BIRMINGHAM dancers who will appear are Patricia Olmstead, Patricia Newhall, Elizabeth Kertz and Winifred Roensch, Ingrid Peterson, Jody Barr, Alice Kent, Barbara Mills, Geraldine Miller, Cynthia Hepburn and Alex Novitsky will contribute the Royal Oak talent. From Pontiac will be Jarvis Baneroff and John Novess.

This rare dance-drama is probably the first production of its kind to be presented in Michigan. The form of "Millennium Sunday" combines the use of dialogue, dance and music, which will actually bring forth three shows, in one.

THE THEME on which "Millennium Sunday" is based, is a revival meeting in which the minister and the devil struggle for control of the congregation.

All chorus and orchestra personnel are local young people, with Art Chatfield, a graduate student in composition at Wayne university, directing the chorus.
