European Traveler Writes Of Last Minute Journeys Before Sailing for States

Miss Souter left for a tour of the continent several weeks ago, determined to travel widely at a minimum of cost. She is back in the United States at this time, ready to report more fully on her financial accomplishments.)

BRUBACH, Germany—Being able to sew is still saving me money!

If you remember, by doing odd jobs of hemming, etc., before I began this trip I earned \$12. By doing odd jobs, such as sewing on buttons and mending torn trousers for the boys, I got my tires pumped, all minor repairs done and flat tires fixed—I have had five to date.

We made these arrangements at the outset of the trip and it sure has paid off.

My bike arrived in Munich after being shipped from Tours, France, with the caps out of order and tires flat. All I had to do was say the word and everything was in order.

We have been back on our bikes for about a week and I am mighty glad. It only takes one harrowing experience on an Italian train, third class, to cure you of the joys of rail travel.

In Naples, for instance, before we had a chance to even get near the boat to get off, hundreds of people swarmed all over getting on. They were kicking, shoving and doing everything in their power to get onto that train.

For most of our tour of Italy we had a chartered bus which was wonderful in comparison. We saw and did so much in our short stay there that we were really saturated with paintings, statues, cathedrals, etc.

THE THREE DAYS in Rome were jammed with sightseeing, the opera, shopping and eating—spumone—a dessert fit for kings.

That city gave me a strange sensation of time. In the same block you can see the ruins of the great colosseum as well as the balcony from which Mussolini spoke to arouse the Italian people.

The very old and the very new are side by side. You can see so clearly how part of the culture of the world was made there.

From Rome we went on to visiting her daughter and her family, Mrs. Madeline Ribolin. The Ribolin's are former Beverly Hill residents.

and three days later we sail for home.

I can truthfully say I have never spent my time in a more enjoyable or worthwhile way.

AS FAR AS my original statement of saving money goes, I will say in many ways I might have been able to save a little by traveling alone, but I feel that I have seen more in the time spent and have been more free from worry by coming with a tour such as this. And—believe it or not—I'll arrive home with money in my pocket!
