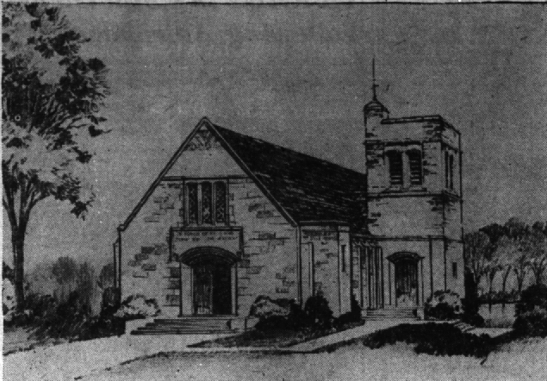

MSC to Build Alumni Memorial Chapel



Michigan State College will begin construction in October of a \$170,000 all-faith memorial chapel, honoring approximately 500 Spartan alumni killed in all wars in which the U. S. has engaged. The structure, financed by contributions of MSC alumni all over the world, is expected to be completed in early spring of 1951. The chapel will be of stone construction and a modified Gothic style, according to Claude Erickson, Lansing, chairman of the MSC alumni building committee. To be located directly across the Red Cedar River from Shaw Hall, the building will seat more than 300 people. It will be open at all times for use by students, alumni, faculty and visitors, and will be used extensively for weddings, memorial services and other sacred events.

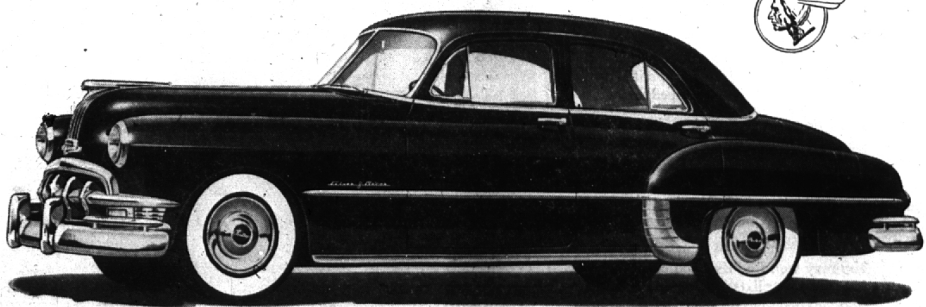

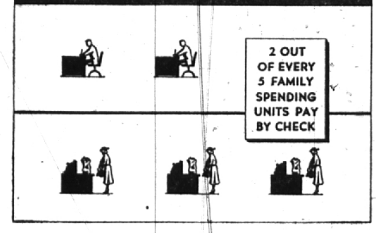
Baptist Church Pays Tribute to Family
