

School Employees At Southfield Get Wage Boost

A \$40 salary boost was granted by the Southfield township school board Monday evening to all its non-contractual employees, according to Glenn Schoenhals, superintendent of schools.

These employees were granted \$100 raises last month and the extra amount will give them a \$140 increase for the year.

The superintendent said that all teachers were given \$200 increases last spring.

In other business, the board received a request from Al J. Lamb, secretary of Boy Scout committee of troop six, asking that the school board cooperate in the procurement of an indoor rifle range.
