

## Objections to Proposed Southfield Fire Hall

Opposition to the site now under consideration for a future fire hall at the corner of Southfield and 13 Mile roads, was expressed Tuesday evening at the Southfield township board meeting by two 13 Mile road residents.

James Flack, 18196 West Thirteen Mile road, read a joint statement which he and William K. Kelsey had prepared. Both men live near the proposed site.

THE SIGNERS pointed out they had no dispute between them and the township board over the necessity of erecting a fire hall, but they believe that there are other sites which would be more convenient for the purpose.

The letter stated, "It was our understanding that a site for the firehouse was proposed on Dec. 28, 1948 in the vicinity of Evergreen and 13 Mile roads and this particular site, if used by the township, would not cause hardship to any of the property owners."

The signers said they had bought their property after investigation of its merits for residential purposes, which include freedom from noise and other "inconveniences

inseparable from the operation of a firehall."

THEY CONCLUDED by requesting that the board reexamine the territory to see if a less objectionable and cheaper site could be obtained.

A committee from the township board was appointed at the Nov. 28 meeting to get in touch with the owners of the site and attempt to negotiate for the purchase of the land.

In other business, a committee consisting of board members Hugh White, Thomas Langran and Urban Woodhouse was appointed to "thoroughly investigate the actions and function of the building department."

This committee will bring its recommendations and report to the board at the next meeting, Dec. 26.

THE MOTION proposing this action was made by White. He said he made the motion because of complaints made against the building department in the past, as well as at Tuesday's meeting.

The men's club of the township

presented another letter listing four more alleged violations of the building ordinance. At the Nov. 28 meeting, the members of this group presented another statement in which six other alleged violations were given.

FRANK GIDLEY, building inspector, gave a report to the board Tuesday evening on the six cases reported by the men's club at the last meeting. He said that two of the owners were already in court. In another instance, a residence has been vacated, he said.

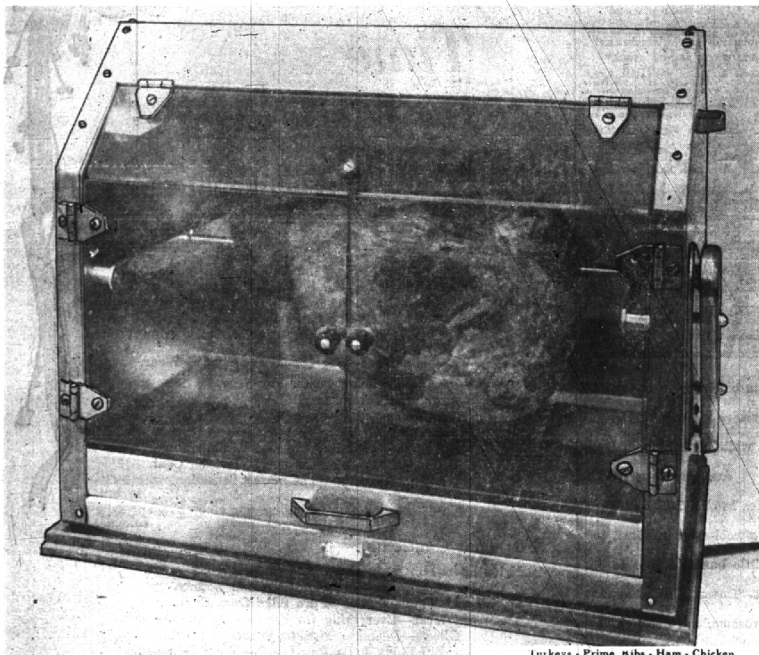
The board also approved a motion that the "township adopt suitable regulations and bylaws for controlling public health conditions in the township."

The special assessment district for road improvements on Cornell from Southfield to Rutland was approved by the board.

The unit operates on 115 Volts, AC, 8.7 Amperes, 1050 Watts.
