

Nemone Balfour Presents Evening Folk Song Recital

Nemone Balfour, singer of folk songs and native of Scotland, was presented in a recital last Thursday evening in the library of Cranbrook House.

The songs came from many lands and expressed many moods. There were melodies from Scotland and England, France and Italy, from Ireland and the Hebrides. Some of the songs were ballads that simply grew from the people and have no author. Miss Balfour sang without programs and the charm of her recital was enhanced by the running commentary she supplied between numbers, giving the history of her songs or the stories connected with them.

FOR HER FIRST group, Miss Balfour composed herself on a 150-year-old lute, in an Italian serenade, "L'Amour de moy" a French song from the 17th century, "Queen Jane Seymour," an historical ballad lost in England but preserved by the Kentucky mountain people, "Ma Fille Voux" a discourse between the mother and daughter, "The Yentler," a pastoral song, and the Scotch reel, "Behave Yourself."

CELTIC SONGS with Irish harp accompaniment included "Blow the Candles Out," the Irish "I Know my Love by his way of Walking," a "Milking Croon" from the Isle of Mist, the Scotch "The Lark" and "Lark about the House," Robert Burns' "Whistle and I'll Come to ye, my lad" and the Highland song, "Dance to Your Shadow."

The concluding group of seasonal songs began with "Green Leaves" an English song dating from 1631, followed by "Gabriel's Sleighing," "The Lark," "Lullaby" and "Miss McKenzie's Party."

Her favorites were "A Letter from London" and "I Know Where I'm Going."

MISS BALFOUR was born and raised in the heart of the Sir Walter Scott country and studied music.
