Will Be No More Public Hearings On Parking Plan

There will be no further public hearings on the proposed off-street parking program for Birmingham, Mayor Bruce G. Booth declared Monday.

"There is no demand from anyone for another public hearing," he explained. "Two meetings were held, one on Oct. 26, the second on Dec. 7. The mayor said two other meetings might be scheduled, but they would be private meetings called at the request of the two groups involved, and to which the city commissioners and city plan commissioners would be invited."

One of those meetings probably will be with the business landowners who would be assessed for parking benefits under the proposed program.

"THERE ALSO IS" some talk that people in the areas which would be used for parking lots may want a meeting with us, but we have not heard officially from either group," Booth said.

If the matter is to be placed on the April ballot, the commission must decide the plan by its Jan. 29 meeting.

City Commissioner Dean G. Beier said Ann Arbor Mayor William E. Brown, Jr., could come here Jan. 3 to discuss with the commission his experiences with Ann Arbor's off-street parking program.

Commissioners asked Beier to make arrangements for Brown to make that Jan. 3 visit.

Hills Commission Discusses Proposed Zoning Ordinance

The proposed new Bloomfield Hills zoning ordinance was discussed at Tuesday evening's meeting of the Bloomfield Hills city commission.

The proposed changes will effect the requirements for cubic contents of dwellings. A public hearing was held on this matter Nov. 27 and about 50 persons attended.

Before any definite action is taken, the city planning commission will make a recommendation.

rest of the initial program, as outlined above, he said.

The commission advanced \$250,000 from the city general fund as a loan to the water department, to be paid back by July 1951 out of current revenues.

Egbert said the water department had the other \$26,266.44 in surplus funds.

If unsettled world conditions prevent the city from going ahead with this second \$250,000 phase of the program, the bonds will not be issued, Egbert said.

In all events, the new tank must be completed in order to have an adequate water reserve next year," he declared.

Petitions from the southeast corner of the township submitted in October called for incorporation of a 4 1/2-mile square area to be known as Southfield Park.
