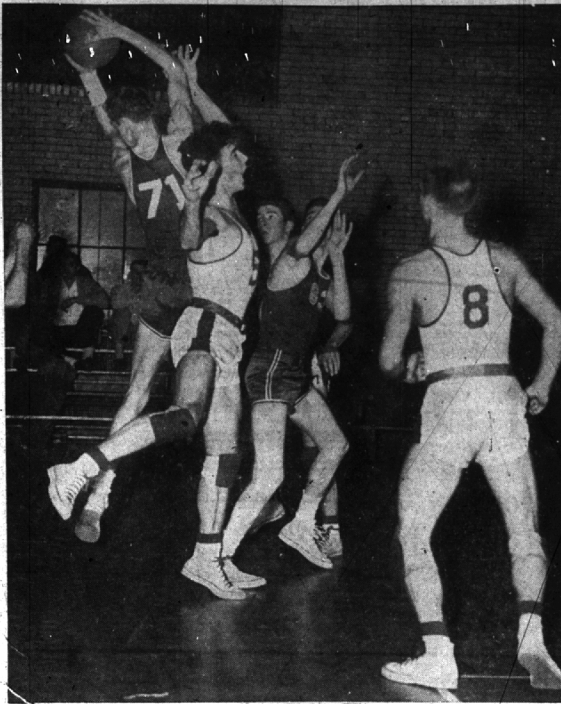

floor at the start of the third period and played for about two minutes. They left with a 50-24 lead. The home team whittled the margin down to 58-36 as the period ended.
