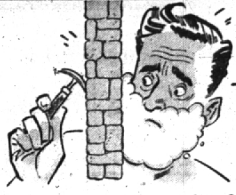


Exchangites Present Program of Music

City Plants 244 Trees During Fall Season

A total of 244 trees were planted by the forestry and parks department this fall, according to the fall planting program report submitted to the city manager and city commission by William R. Lebold, superintendent of the department.

Cost of the fall planting program was \$591. Lebold pointed out the trees which were planted were 206 hard maples, five European mountain ash, two flowering crab, one Pauls Scarlet Hawthorne, 10 sweet gum, one blue spruce, seven red pine and 12 white pines.

A total of 108 hard maple trees were planted on city streets in all parts of town. Lebold stated

that all requests for trees made by Nov. 1, were filled.

Streets where trees were planted are Yorkshire, Dorchester, Lincoln, Greenwood, Larchlea, Southaven, Washington boulevard, Pleasanton, Bowers, Melton, Argyle, Golfview, Pine, Brookwood, Emmons, Birmingham boulevard, Westchester Way, Northlawn, Winthrop, Chestnut, Cole, Villa, Yosemite, Hanbury, Ruffner, Highland and Torry.

Springdale park, St. James park and Stanley boulevard had a total of 136 trees planted. A breakdown reveals that 35 were planted at Springdale, 27 at St. James and 74 on Stanley.

All 244 trees were watered when necessary, and all except

the pines and other low branch trees wrapped to prevent winter sun scalding.

In addition to the trees planted throughout the city, 270 hard maple and American elms were dug, trimmed, barked and heeled in at the Springdale park nursery. These trees will be moved to the new nursery site on Derby road as soon as ground conditions permit. The forester added that a limited amount of small white pine and red pine trees will also be moved to the Derby site from Springdale.

Lebold estimated 100% survival for the European mountain ash, flowering crab, hawthorn, blue spruce, red pine and white pine. He also stated that 85 to 90%
