### Southfield Twp. Fire Hall Site On Board Agenda

A committee from the Southfield township board will report at Tuesday's meeting on the status of negotiations for the acquisition of property on the northeast corner of Southfield and 18 Mile for the site of a future fire hall.

The owners of the property have been reluctant to sell and the committee was authorized to make an offer. The board is considering condemnation proceedings if negotiations fail.

**THE PROPERTY** has been described as "ideal" for the location of a fire hall by township fire chief Alfred Krutz. The site is located four miles from the station at Evergreen and 10 Mile.

Building Inspector Frank Gidley will also report back to the board in answer to charges by members of the Southfield Men's club, Inc. that there have been violations of the building ordinance in their section.

In a letter to the board, five club members cited six alleged violations and asked that action be taken. At last week's meeting, Gidley said that some of the cited cases have already been taken care of.

Supervisor D. P. Frame said that a date still hasn't been set for a hearing for Stanley and Violet Pons to show cause why an injunction shouldn't be issued to restrain them from entering their miller camp on Southfield road.
