# National Conference Opened in Detroit; Localities Attending

Seven persons from Birmingham will attend and take part in the four-day national conference on church and economic life which opens today in the Statler hotel in Detroit.

The conference will be attended mainly by church workers selected from every profession and field. They will meet with theologians and economists to consider the great economic problems of our day.

The District of Columbia, Canada and some 28 states will be represented by an 450 expected delegates.

Sponsored by the Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America, this second conference will again have laymen and pastors considering the parts the church can play in solving economic ills.

It will also show the power of economic conditions over the church, and present the challenge of how the two can be made to work together for the benefit of the world.
