## Walnut Lake Man Tells of Europe's Reactions to USA

Phil H. Emrich, of Walnut Lake, returned Saturday from a three-week trip through several European countries. He is head of products service division of Vickers, Incorporated of Detroit, and traveled as their representative.

His business took him to Rotterdam, Amsterdam, Brussels, Antwerp, Zurich, Paris and London where he had a chance to observe the use of American funds under the Marshall plan.

In all the countries he visited, Emrich saw the great expenditure of this money. He spent a good part of his time in Holland, where they are operating efficiently. Rotterdam, the city which lost 28,000 of its citizens in a concentrated bombing attack and was leveled to the ground, is making a dogged recovery. Airports, completely demolished, are rebuilt and are operating efficiently. This is true of most airports throughout Europe, he said.

Shoes and everyday clothing are priced approximately the same as in the United States. Wages, being much lower, make these items very expensive to the population. American goods are much wanted, but the devaluation of currency has cut imports seriously. Foreign trade with this country is down from an index of 90 per cent to 40 per cent.

In spite of these difficulties one sees frequent signs of "help wanted". There is plenty of work to be done in most countries.

Emrich was able to spend two days in Switzerland, where he did some skiing. Life in countries catering to tourists is becoming less rigorous, he said, and Zurich reminded him very much of our own San Francisco.

Everywhere he went Emrich said he met the utmost good-will toward Americans. The fact was brought home to him constantly that the average European associates the word "America" with "Utopia." "Any American," he said, "returning to this country has a renewed sense of gratitude for, and an appreciation of, the responsibilities of being a plain American citizen."

## Final Rites Held for Early Settler of Highland Park

Frank F. Holznapf, 88, who died at his home, 1523 W. Maple, Thursday, was one of the pioneers of this section of the city, settling in Highland Park in April, 1886, before it became an incorporated city.

He was born in Long Island City, N. Y., and was a florist by trade. At the time Highland Park was a village, he was one of the two businessmen in that area. He was a business partner of Capt. William Stevens, founder of that community.

He served both as president of the village and its treasurer and was one of the first members of the Highland Park school board. The Holznapf florist shop on Woodward avenue is now operated by his son, Frank F. Holznapf, Jr.

He lived here after retirement. While a resident of Highland Park, Mr. Holznapf, a fancier of trotting horses, often drove his own entries on the Birmingham track located on what is now the Ford company property.

After his retirement from active business in 1918, Mr. Holznapf made his home in Birmingham. As a member of the Birmingham gun club he won the state doubles trap shooting championship in 1923.

He was a life member of Palestine lodge, P.E.A.M., and a 32nd degree Mason.

The survivors include his wife, Emily; his son; five daughters, Mrs. N. B. Webber of Birmingham, Mrs. George Siler of New York, Mrs. John Stephens of Greeley, Colo., Mrs. Ruth Rathbone of La Jolla, Calif., and Mrs. Milton H. Berts of Birmingham. There are 20 grandchildren and 25 great grandchildren.

Services were held from the Bell funeral home Saturday with burial in Royal Oak cemetery. The Rev. Wilbur Webber, pastor of the Baptist church and a grandson of Mr. Holznapf, officiated.
