NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS OF THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM, MICHIGAN

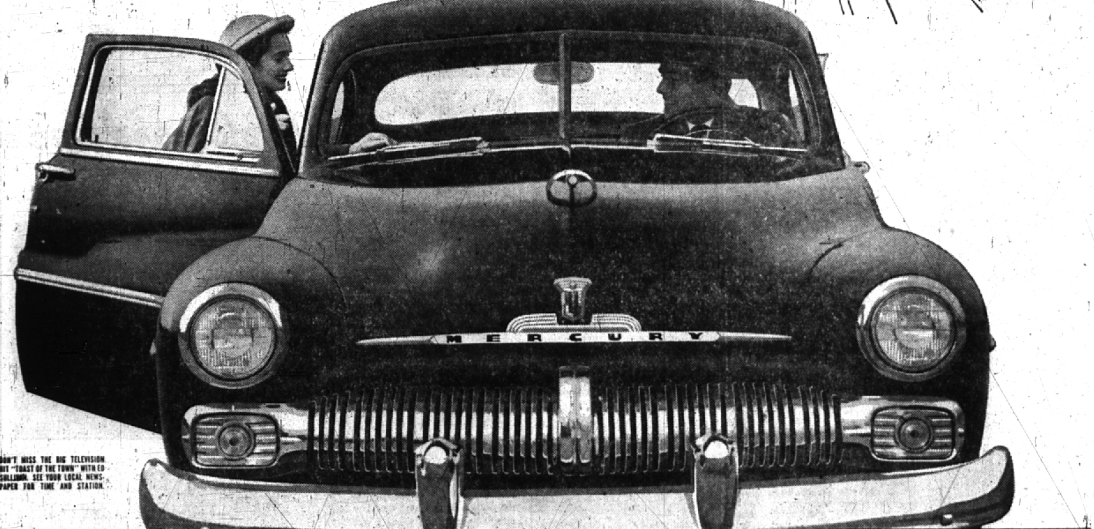
City taxes due July 1, 1949, and County and School taxes due Dec. 1, 1949, may be paid at the office of the City Treasurer in the Municipal Building until Feb. 28, 1950. Personal property taxes must be paid in full by this time.

After Feb. 28, 1950, real estate taxes are payable at the office of the Oakland County Treasurer in Pontiac. If paid between Mar. 1, 1950 and April 15, 1950, a tax certificate of 1949 taxes due must first be secured at the office of the City Treasurer.
