Guest Preacher

DR. T. T. BRUMBAUGH
 The Rev. Theobald T. Brumbaugh, associate secretary of the board of missions and church extension of the Methodist Church for Japan, Korea and the Philippines, will be the guest speaker at the First Methodist Church, Birmingham, on Thursday, Jan. 19, at 7:30 p.m. The program of the evening begins at 6:30 p.m. with a pot-luck supper.
 Dr. Brumbaugh, while serving as executive director of the Council of Churches and previous to that was for 17 years a missionary of the Methodist Church in Japan, Korea and the Philippines. He served college and university students in Tokyo and other educational centers.
 Born in Agosta, Ohio, Dr. Brumbaugh was educated at Ohio Wesleyan University and at Boston University School of Theology. He first went to Japan in 1924 as a missionary of the Methodist Church. He left that country in 1941 when the Methodist Church recalled its missionaries during the invasion of war.
 Because of the immensity of the religious, social and political problems in Japan, Korea and the Philippine Islands, he has twice met and discussed these conditions with General Douglas MacArthur, and on one occasion was granted an audience with Emperor Hirohito.
 In Korea, he talked with General Hodge, Dr. Singman Rhee and other outstanding leaders there.
 In the Philippines, he traveled widely and met religious, social and educational leaders of the country.
 Dr. Brumbaugh is, therefore, qualified to discuss intelligently various aspects of America's relations with the Far East and the responsibilities of the Christian church in the Orient.
