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Lebrun Exhibition Open at Cranbrook

An exhibit of 35 drawings by Rico Lebrun, distinguished Los Angeles artist, will be on view at the museum of the Cranbrook Academy of Art from Jan. 15 through Feb. 12.

This exhibition was organized by the Modern Institute of Art in Beverly Hills, Calif., and is circulated by the American Federation of Arts as part of a series featuring contemporary drawings. Vincent Price, who is a trustee of the federation, selected the present drawings from over 400 executed by Lebrun in the course of the last three years.

These dramatic, often disturbing drawings, so different from the brilliant Neo-Expressionist style which characterized the artist's earlier work, deal exclusively with religious themes.

His current project, for which most of the present drawings are preliminary studies, is a monumental Crucifixion consisting of several large panels. Among the subjects are "Witnesses to the Crucifixion," "Crucifixion of Mary," "Weeping Magdalene," "Roman Soldier," etc. Other religious subjects include "Massacre of the Innocents," "Sleeping Soldiers," "Horsemen," and "Mob Scene."
