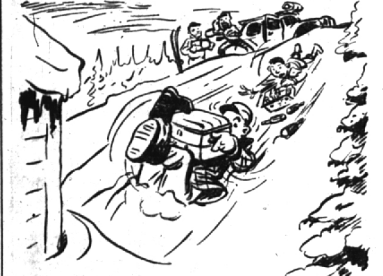

## Christian Science Lecture Presented by Boston Woman

An audience which filled the church auditorium attended Monday night's lecture on Christian Science given by Margaret Morrison, CS, of Boston, Mass.

Sponsored by the First Church of Christ, Scientist of Birmingham, the lecture was entitled, "Christian Science: The Pathway of Light." Miss Morrison is a member of the Board of Lectureship of the Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Mass.

Miss Morrison's text was substantially as follows: "The first commandment from God given in the Bible is, 'Let there be light.' and the record reads, 'There was light.' It further states that 'God saw the light, that it was good.' In this light that was good, there is no darkness, and all these things shall be added unto you."

As in the realm of the physical senses light only can dispel darkness, so in the mental realm spiritual understanding only can dispel the darkness of materiality, or that mental ignorance which is called matter.

It has been said of Jesus that "first he wrought of men, then he taught" (Chaucer). This may also be said about the Discoverer and Founder of Christian Science, Mary Baker Eddy.

For some years after her healing, which came about through the use of her own mind, she has a record of healing in the Bible, she studied consecratedly the words and works of the prophets and apostles, and proved, by many works of healing, the truth of her discovery; before she gave it to the world in the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures."

One of the most radical of the changes made in thought as the light of spiritual understanding is approached is made in regard to the nature of matter which is called substance.

The thought of substance is inevitably linked up with the thought of supply and demand, and is one of the darkest spots in the human mind today; ignorance of what constitutes supply and demand of God's gracious and loving law of abundance.

Poverty is always and only a mental argument, a false concept, never a real condition or fact, and therefore must be healed mentally. Matter never brought enlightenment on any subject, so no amount of money or material wealth of gold.

This Sunday, the Rev. Emil Kuntz will preach on "The Fellowship of the Forgiveness." The pamphlet for the day bears the same title. Of special interest locally is the fact that Rev. Kuntz is the author of the leaflet.

An addition to the morning program has been made at the church when at 10:45, organist Mrs. Walter E. Turner, presents "Organ Meditation Time" for a quarter of eight. The service is open at 10:30 a.m. for all who wish to avail themselves of this music.

The church school, as reported by George A. Jackson, is growing rapidly with a notable increase in enrollment and a number of new teachers. In addition to graded classes for all ages of children, there are Bible study classes for youth and adults.
