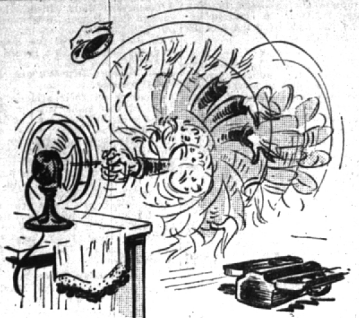


### Boy Scout Troop B'S to Hold Paper Drive

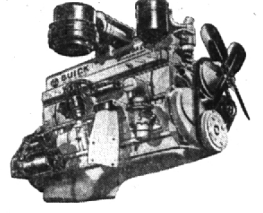
