Guest Speaker

"Democratization of Germany" will be the topic of Dr. Harold M. Dorr's address to the Birmingham branch of AAUW at a luncheon meeting on January 11 at 12:45 P.M. in the Community House.

Upon the basis of his observations and study of conditions during a three-month stay in Germany last spring and summer, Dr. Dorr will survey some of the factors that have combined to make the path of democracy a thorny one in Germany including the cold war between U.S. and Russia.

Dr. Dorr has stated that "We must continue our program of democratization. The Germans have not yet been reached and are not wholly sympathetic. With the withdrawal of American influence, the whole plan disintegrates."

Professor of political science at the University of Michigan he has been a member of the faculty for more than 20 years. Besides being a member of many political science associations, Dr. Dorr is at present chairman of the social science committee of the Michigan Council on Adult Education and community consultant for the Bruce Adult Education Fund of the State Department of Public Instruction.
