The Birmingham American Legion junior baseball team continued to set the pace in the district league as it defeated Millford Monday evening 7-5. The win was the locals' sixth against one loss. The Birmingham nine made four runs in the first inning on singles by Halpin, Olin and Sheldon and a double by Peacock. It added two more tallies in the third and a final run in the sixth. Tom Tracy and Jerry Pike pitched for the winners.

**THE GAME** ended the first round of play and Birmingham will compete with either Royal Oak or Millford in the district playoffs before the second round gets under way.

**Tax Commission Considers Appeal Of Southfield**

Louis E. Nims, state tax commission chairman, said Tuesday that a ruling may be given within a week concerning Southfield township's appeal that its equalized valuation is too high.

The commission met with members of the county board of supervisors to consider the appeal made by Southfield Supervisor D. P. Frame.

The equalized valuation figure for Southfield as set by the equalization committee of the board of supervisors was \$35,485,645. The assessed valuation is \$35,990,125.

Nims said the group that his survey of assessments in the county have turned up "considerable variance" among taxing units.
