State Tax Commission Lowers Southfield Equalization Rate

The equalized valuation of Southfield township has been reduced from \$35,436,817 to \$32,997,850 by ruling of the Michigan State tax commission.

The decision was in accord with an appeal made two months ago by D. P. Frame, Southfield supervisor. He had protested the original figure as set by the county board of supervisors, claiming it was an increase.

The tax commission announced the decision after meeting with the board of supervisors to consider the appeal. Spokesmen said they could find no basis for such an increase.

Members of the board of supervisors equalization committee had said there was enough new building in the township to justify the increase.

The equalized valuation for the township last year was slightly lower, \$32,587,402.

Norwegian Talks on Work of Underground During World War II

Knut Ericson told members of the Rotary club at their Monday meeting of his experiences as a member of the Norwegian underground during World War II.

A graduate of the University of Norway, from which he has a B.S. degree in civil engineering, Ericson began his underground work almost immediately after the German occupation in 1940.

With all means of communication caused by the invaders he worked with the group which established forbidden radio contact and from this source printed news pamphlets for distribution.

ERICSON ALSO told of the work done by members of the underground in destroying German equipment, supplies and centers of industry.
