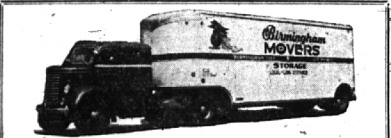

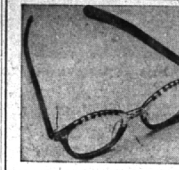

## Hearst Junior Golf Tourney Held Here

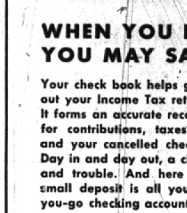
